SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS Suzanne L. Kelly

Dear Residents:

Over the past couple of months our District has been working closely with other area schools to determine ways to reduce costs and share services. All 18 component districts in St. Lawrence County have been working with the consultant team made up of the Rural Schools Association and Organizational Leadership Services. This study was broken into six areas which included: Demographics & Finance, Central Business Office, Transportation-Food-Facilities Management, Shared Services, Technology, Secondary Programs and Administrative Staffing and Human Resources.

Once the data is compiled, the findings will be shared with the Superintendents, Boards of Education, Staff, and Community Members. A summary review will be shared, showing trends in enrollment and expenditure/revenue projections.

Preliminary budget allocations have been received for the 2011-12 school year. The figures are upsetting and also leading us to look for new cost saving ways while preparing our budget. Our school had seen reductions in State Aid and must also deal with the loss of Federal Stimulus Funds, which will no longer be available. This will be a challenge, but our goal will remain to provide quality education for all of our students. The budget hearing will be on Tuesday, May 10, 2011 and I urge you to attend this meeting.

Juniors will participate in this program at school on Wednesday, March 23, 2011 from 8:00 - 11:15am. Sign up in the guidance office by March 12.



Teacher Requests

Again this year, we are not accepting teacher requests. At many of the grade levels, there are only two staff. We do carefully consider how students are placed at each grade. It is also important that we put a mixture of students with varying social, emotional, and academic abilities and needs in all rooms.

As parents, we all want the best for our own child, and this is certainly understandable. However, we must look at 35-50 students per grade level and plan for their success. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Field Trips

Each teacher is responsible for planning their own field trip. The end-of-the-year activities vary greatly depending on age and curriculum studied. The trips are meant to be a positive experience for everyone and for the group to grow together as a whole.

Each grade level has a set procedure for the number of chaperones and how they are chosen. Unfortunately, we can't always take all the parents who would like to attend. We do ask that if you are participating on a scheduled field trip that you don't bring younger children along that may distract from the focus of the day.

Some groups request a bag lunch be packed to help keep cost at a minimum. The cafeteria is always willing to pack a lunch for any student interested. These brown bags include a sandwich of their choice, usually ham, turkey, or PB&J, a fruit, a drink, and a treat of some sort. The cost is whatever you pay on a regular day. Teachers do take orders for these lunches with each trip. If you pack a lunch, please do not send any glass bottles or any food that requires preparation.

Mid-year Thoughts

I have completed my first semester at Edwards-Knox Central School and in that time have begun to learn about the people in this community. Many staff members have commented on what an awesome place this is to work and what great students we have in our school. I have been able to attend many after school functions and see parents in attendance that care about their children, who are supportive and want what is best for them. I see many grandparents at the same school functions that raised their children in this community and now see their children raising the next generation here as well. I see pride in these families.

I would like to challenge the community to take a hard look at the test score results from last year that their children received on the state tests and rally around our efforts in school to raise these results. We offer Academic Intervention Services to help our students, Math, Science, and English Labs to work on weaknesses and receive extra support, and Homework Club on Tuesdays and Thursdays (if they are in the Junior High). Our teachers are collecting benchmark measurements that assess how the students are progressing. This data is being used to identify students who need even more help. When you receive that phone call that says your child is not completing their homework or we are having problems with behavior in school that is interfering with learning, we need you to stress to your child how important school is. If you have a concern with a report grade, call that teacher to find out what seems to be the issue. Emphasize to your child that **failure is not an option**.

The state exams that your children take will provide a snap shot of how we are doing academically at E-KCS. **Motivation to do well** on the test is one of the first challenges we need to address with our children. I talked to a student the other day who asked why she had to go into a math lab. I told her that through the teacher's efforts she had been identified as needing extra help to do well on the Math test at the end of the year. Her response was that she has always failed the test. I simply told her that was not acceptable. Her teacher asked me later what I said to this student because she has been working harder in class since our chat. My question to you is, "is it that simple?" Do we just need to let our students know what we expect? Do we follow through with our expectations? Do we hold our children accountable to meet those expectations? When I say "we" I am referring to the team of people who care about your children; teachers, parents, grandparents, community members, administrators, coaches, and other staff members in our school. Let's **raise that level of pride** we have in our children by seeing an improvement in achievement on the state tests in May and June!

Winter Olympics 2010



Here we are submitting articles in the March and April newsletter already.

On January 13, 2011, USDA issued new guidelines for the National school breakfast and lunch program. Some of the new proposed rules limits the total servings of starchy vegetables (potatoes, peas, corn, lima beans) to 1 cup per week. This means the elimination of these items from breakfast (hash, hash browns) and limits us to two servings per week at lunch. It is possible that we can only offer juice for breakfast one day a week and the rest of the time we must offer fruit. The government is not increasing the amount of money they allot for this, so more than likely we will serve government canned fruit for breakfast. It is our hope that by serving fresh tossed salad, fresh vegetables, and fruits each day, everyone can find a fruit and a vegetable they like.

I want to make you aware that some real changes may have to happen in the coming year. We continue to struggle to provide healthy choices every day, while trying to keep costs down. We may soon be required to make children take extra items to constitute a meal, even if it is an item they don't want. It is possible the required food on the tray will change, forcing students to take more fruits and vegetables, and not letting juice fulfill a fruit requirement.

I also want to make you aware that there is a policy in place that **does not allow you to charge over 3 days without a payment**. That amount totals about \$7.75. We are no longer allowed to give the main lunch if you owe more than that amount and we then serve either peanut butter or cheese sandwiches.

Your child's lunch account balance can be found online at www.mynutrikids.com. This is a free service. You may also set it up to e-mail you if the balance is low, or you can call me at anytime to find out student balances at 562-8130 X 1507. However, we will be sticking to the Board of Education Policy for students owing more than 3 charges. I understand this situation is difficult for the students, the cashiers and myself, so please try to keep your money on your child's account, send money in with the child, or send a bag lunch. Even better would be to fill out a meal application if you can't pay the price for meals to qualify for free or reduced meals. Our school receives many benefits if you qualify for the program.

At E-K we have tried to keep lunch fun and enjoyable and at the same time make it healthy. We don't sell snack foods on the line and this was a decision our school board made in 2000. I am proud to say they have stuck to it. They have not caved in to financial pressures to use it to supplement our lunch program. We are ahead of guidelines with serving nothing about 1% milk, and serving whole grain rolls and bread. We serve fresh fruit and vegetables every day and not an overabundance of baked goods.

I did want to make you aware that some mandates are not in our control, and new guidelines can be very strict. I will continue to work to serve healthy and nutritious meals for your child/ren, at an affordable price, keeping in mind the cost to the taxpayers.

I hope you all enjoy an early Spring as we enter the last part of the school year.
