SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS Suzanne L. Kelly

School is back in full force and we have all settled down into familiar routines. With the return to school some students are reporting increased episodes of cyberbullying. For those of you not familiar with the term cyberbullying it is an online social cruelty, or electronic bullying. The act is intentional and often done to tease, harass or embarrass an individual or a group of people. There are many ways that cyberbullying can occur ie.: emails, Instant Messaging (IM), texting, sending altered pictures or images, through social networks such as Facebook or My Space, Web pages and Blogs. With so many people having cell phones and access to computers the abuses are rapidly multiplying becoming a problem on a daily basis.

Technology has made it all too easy for people to strike out at others due to the anonymity of being online. What once was not acceptable to say or do can now be easily posted or texted without much fear, thought or regards for the truth. These rumors or images can be passed around for others to see and never have to face the intended target. The reality is that what is said online or electronically can have serious effects offline and lead to consequences at school.

We have been forced to deal with several issues already this school year that have surprised some students and parents. What has been said at home or outside of school is now entering into school as students begin to talk about the latest rumor or altered photograph sent out to twenty-five or so students in less than two minutes. If a student suffers emotional or psychological effects due to cyberbullying we are legally bound to deal with these issues.

Help us to deal with these overwhelming situations by talking to your children. Know what your child is doing when he or she is online. Have your computer in a visible area and set limits about the time of use. Cellphones should be placed in plane view during hours of sleep to avoid late night texting. Occasionally check and see who your child is "friending" or has as contacts. Being informed reduces the chances that your child is participating or receiving these hurtful comments.

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SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS CONT'D.

Many of us grew up hearing if you have nothing nice to say, say nothing at all; or remember the "golden rule". These are still true today; parents truly have a great deal of impact on their children and their actions. Take the time to let them know where you stand on these issues. Together we can make a difference!

SAT and ACT REGISTRATION DEADLINES

The SAT and ACTs are college entrance tests that some colleges require. Seniors who are planning to go to college and have not yet taken or would like to retake the SAT or the ACT test should consider doing so as soon as possible. Juniors who would like to take these tests are encouraged to wait until May or June of this year unless there are special admission requirements for a program or selective admissions process. The registration deadlines and their test dates are listed below.

Students should carefully check the catalog of each prospective college to determine whether the examinations are required.

Registration materials can be picked up in the High School Guidance Office or can be completed on-line at **www.collegeboard.com** for the SAT and **www.actstudent.org** for the ACT. The registration process takes some time so students are encouraged to start early, DO NOT WAIT FOR THE REGISTRATION DEADLINE TO START THE REGISTRATION MATERIALS!

AWARD CEREMONIES

In an effort to continue rewarding Elementary Level accomplishments and supporting positive behaviors and academic achievement, students in grades K- 8 will again participate in the four awards ceremonies this year. Some of the awards that students can earn include honor roll, citizenship, effort, positive bus conduct, and perfect attendance. STATE ASSESSMENTS

New York State will continue the assessment program for the students in grades 3 through 8 in the areas of English Language Arts (ELA) and math. Grades 4 & 8 will also take a science performance test. New York State has eliminated the Grade 5 and Grade 8 Social Studies Tests as one of the cost reduction measures.

Students should be sure to get plenty of sleep the night before a test and eat a good breakfast in the morning. They will also need to bring two #2 pencils to the test. The test dates will fall between the following dates:

BANANA SPLITS

For many years Edwards-Knox has conducted a program called "Banana Splits". Groups have been formed to help students handle issues resulting from divorce, death, and/or separation in their families. We call these groups "Banana Splits".



The purpose of each group is to establish peer support for children who share feelings of loss and change. The purpose is <u>not</u> to provide in-depth counseling, but to give students a time and a place to express themselves in a safe group of peers. Suggestions and comments for dealing with issues come from the group. Discussions focus on appropriate solutions.

These groups will begin in early November; students will be invited to one initial meeting of BANANA SPLITS and will then receive a permission slip to be sent home.

INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING

Students can participate in individual counseling with permission from their parents/guardians. Teachers can refer students for counseling or parents can request this service. Counseling focuses on the present by addressing a specific issue or concern. The counselor assists the student in identifying goals, strategies, and skills to cope with, or eliminate, unwanted behaviors or emotions.

SOCIAL SKILLS GROUPS

This counseling process encourages students to demonstrate appropriate behaviors as they relate to social skills. These include:

- Classroom Behaviors listening, raising hand to answer, completing homework, etc.
- Peer Relationships making friends, joining in a group, tolerating differences, initiating conversations, expressing feelings, personal space, etc.

Students will be guided to practice appropriate behaviors in a fun, interactive setting.

The school counseling program and the school counselors will work with parents, teachers, and administrators to provide students with the support they need to participate successfully in school. *Emphasis will be placed on student needs as they relate to school success*.

NEW "OUT OF SCHOOL SUSPENSION" CONCEPT

There are discipline issues that occur in school that warrant a student being temporarily removed from the school population. In the past, the school would suspend these students out of school and the child would be sent home for a length of time determined by the administration. For many students this was viewed as a reward instead of as a consequence and the result was students were falling behind their peers academically because they were not in school.

To address this problem we have introduced a new concept regarding out of school suspension. Parents are contacted regarding the suspension and are offered the opportunity to have their child monitored in school by a substitute teacher who serves as a mentor, tutor, and counselor for the length of time their child is on out of school suspension. The parent must agree to transport their child to school, arriving at 8:30 (after the student body is in their scheduled classes), and pick their child up at 3:00 (after the student body has departed on the buses). The student and their monitor are housed in a room that was once an office, with a window to the outside and a window to the hall, but is now used as a custodial storage closet in the elementary wing of the school. Breakfast and lunch are brought to the student and bathroom breaks are provided to the students. Students are provided work that is currently being completed in class, incomplete work that was not finished and/or turned in, and in some cases, future work that gets the student ahead in their class. A library book is also provided for reading practice.

NEW "OUT OF SCHOOL SUSPENSION" CONCEPT CONT'D.

There are several benefits to this program.

- It provides a message to the students that being in school is important to their success.
- It shows the student that we care enough about them that we are willing to provide an adult mentor to work with them intensely for a few days to help guide them to make better decisions when they return to the regular school program.
- It allows the student an opportunity to get all their work completed and walk back into the classroom at the same place the rest of the class is instead of trying to play catch-up and overloading them with make-up work.
- It does not allow a student freedom to socialize with other students while in school which is a big reason many students like to come to school. This encourages students to do the right thing the next time.
- It allows the parent to partner with the school and support the school's efforts to educate their child by reinforcing the consequence. Parents who transport their child to school to be held accountable for their actions are letting their child know they believe school is important as well.






Remember to be a Fan, Not a Fanatic, at Athletic Events

- Remember who's on the field. Don't try to live through your child.
- Remember ROOTS respect Rules, Opponents, Officials, Teammates.
- Take the long view. Nearly all kids who play sports will not end up as fessionals. Do what you can to make sure your teen enjoys sports for a lifetime.
- Don't be the coach. During the game, let the coach be the person who tells players what they're doing wrong. Focus on what all players (not just yours) are doing right.
- Don't embarrass your child. Before you get angry or yell at a referee, ask one thing. "Will this embarrass my child or our team?" Then keep quiet.
- Let your athlete know you're proud of him no matter what the outcome of the game.

Hello Everyone!

Please go to our website http://www.ekcsk12.org and click on CAFÉ to sign up for www.mynutrikids.com. It is a free service and you can see how much money is on your student's account, what they have been eating for the month and have it e-mail you when you child is getting low on funds.

Also remember that your meal application only extends from October 1 to September 29 of the next year. If you haven't filled out a new meal application and sent it in, you need to do that. As of October 1 all students who have not sent in a new application must become full price.

Please explain to students that can't or don't read this that at lunch they have to take 3 of 5 items to constitute a meal. If you are a free or reduced student this is really important, because you will be charged ala carte prices if you don't take a full meal. The government requires this. At breakfast you must take a Juice, a Milk and at least 1 other item. You may take 2 other items, but you must take at least 1 to constitute a breakfast meal. The same applies for breakfast that is at lunch.

There will be inspectors here soon and we need to assure that students are receiving what they should. These rules exist so that you get well balanced nutrition. If you end up not being able to eat everything you take, you may put it in the basket that we put out, or give it to a friend. If you put it in the basket, anyone who would like extra food may go to the basket and take out what they want. There is usually juice and/or milk and other items. We would like to see someone make use of it, rather than seeing it thrown away.

Have wonderful vacations. This is the season of holidays you know. Remember to eat healthy and give your body some exercise, and have fun while you are doing it.
